

Reforms 2004-08


- Reporting directly to Government- functioning as a Ministry
- Devolve powers to Federal Fisheries Agency
- Establishment of Government Fisheries
 Commission (& its working groups)
- By Statute a coordinating body for federal bodies for cooperation and policy
- Improved governance
- Facilitating reform and adoption of regulations

Governance & Policy- key features

- Significant improvements over the last 15 years
- More still in the last 3 years
- A fisheries culture retaining the values of integration from the Soviet Era and...
- A modern reformation of management organization and regime based on internationally accepted principles of fishery sustainability

Policy Objectives

- Federal Fisheries Act 'protection and rationale use' of aquatic biological resources
- Strategy to 2020 socio and economic development
- Focus upon improved customs control, prevent overfishing, improve efficiency and economic return from fishing opportunities, food security, social welfare and fish consumption
- 'Rationale long term sustained use'

International Agreements

Russian Federation has signed and ratified following relevant international agreements:

- 1982 UN Law of the Sea (UNCLOS)
- 1995 Implementation of Provisions of UN Convention of the Law of the Sea
- Highly migratory and straddling fish stocks
- Russian Constitution of 1993 places
 International Agreements above national law

Federal Fisheries Act 2004

A framework law of 8 Chapters and 57 Articles

- General provisions, rights to aquatic resources, fisheries, fishing rights, fisheries management, protection of aquatic resources and the environment, dispute settlement, concluding provisions
- The Act is supported by other Laws- EEZ of Russian Federation, Law on Fauna, Customs Code
- Implemented by Regionally applicable Regulations

Fisheries Act - Chapter 3 - on Fisheries

Extensive provisions including..

- Specific consideration of industrial, coastal, research, artisanal and recreational fishing
- Amended 2007 'mandatory landing of Russian Exclusive Economic Zone - EEZ catches in Russia
- Act implemented via a series of Regulations

Relationship of Act and Regulations

- Federal Fisheries Act applies nationally
- Most regulations apply at the level of a 'fishery basin' (8 basins) (e.g Far Eastern Fisheries Basin) etc
- Regulations set rules e.g. seasons, closed areas, gears, by-catches, min. allowable sizes etc

Consultation: Roles & Responsibilities

- Legacy of Soviet era where integration was a strong feature of management
- Widespread consultation of agencies, science institutions, industry organizations and user groups
 e.g. Research institutions are highly integrated within the Federal and Regional management structure
- High level of consultation of industry & science remains
- Now more formal, established procedures and for a are established for consultation and decision making

Formal Consultation: Fishery Councils

 Informal dialogue and consultation of industry and government in place

Formal bodies established:

- Industry level: Federal Fisheries Council 2008
- At Basin level: Far Eastern Fishery Council
- At Regional level: Primorsky Council

Scientific Institutions

- Central level VNIRO All Russian Scientific Institute for Fisheries Research and Oceanography
- Basin level TINRO Far Eastern Scientific Institute for Fisheries Research & Oceanography
- Regions- KamchatNIRO, MagadinNIRO, SakNIRO (supporting research in WBS and SoO)
- Co-ordinated research across fishery stocks, fishing activities, environmental interactions, oceanographic conditions

Enforcement

- Russian EEZ- Federal Border Service (part of Federal Security Service (FSB)
- At sea inspection of fishery
- At sea inspection of transhipments
- At shore inspection of landings and clearance prior to export
- FFA retains enforcement in territorial waters

Reform of Quota Allocation

- Prior to 2000 global TAC's
- 2000-3 Quota Auctions
- Allocated on a year by year basis
- Reduce older fleet, improve efficiency
- 2007 amendments 10 year quotas
- Economic stability for renewal
- Administered by FFA and its territorial divisions

Improving enforcement

- 2007 reform requires all Landing to be at Russian ports - improved ability to inspect
- Less incentive to overfish/under-report
- Quota levies also reduced for selling fish domestically
- Integration of Monitoring and CommunicationCenter

Vessel Reporting Requirements

- FFA Territorial Divisions implement and monitor quota use
- Daily vessel reporting requirements (vessels and shippers)
- 15 day reporting requirements (vessels and shippers)
- Vessel monitoring requirements VMS
- Central Monitoring and Communications Federal and Regional branches- database on fishing activity
- Federal Border Guard Service State Marine Inspection (GMI) At sea
 and at port inspection
- FFA Territorial Divisions- port inspection and...
- EU IUU Catch Certification documentation including for fish exported for processing before EU entry

Monitoring and Inspection

- GMI (State Marine Inspection) of the Federal Security
 Service undertake spot checks of vessels and shippers
- Regional branches allow effective cover of all fishing grounds
- All transhipments are monitored by GMI
- FFA Regional branches undertake reconciliation of daily reports, 15 day reports for vessels and shippers
- Coordination of activities of agencies thru Central
 Monitoring and Communication Center

Consultation & Dispute Resolution

- Councils at different levels serve as the formal consultative fora for industry, science and government- e.g. Far East Fisheries Council
- The Ministry of Natural Resources 'State Ecological Expertise' has specific role for stakeholder consultation within the TAC setting process
- These for a serve to avoid disputes both at Policy setting level and at implementation
- The Russian Court system handles enforcement violation disputes
